Bag Gardens, Mini-Bags & Keyhole Gardens

Entries will be considered on the choice of plants that you add to your Starter Kit, how well your plants have grown, the record of plants you grew from seed, your garden's organic content... and, of course, your creativity!

Please use peat-free compost as it has far less impact on the environment.

Sunflowers & Tip-Taps (Free Entry)

Sunflower heights are measured from the soil to the centre of the flowerhead. It's simple - the tallest one wins! For Tip-Taps, ingenuity is the key... the most inventive and effective design will take the trophy.

In every category points will be given for design, decoration, use of recycled materials, and your entry's 'green credentials'.

Please include photos of your entry with this form, and put your name on the back of each one (try and keep a copy of these in case you are a winner!) and then fill in the other side of this form.

Please note: Send a Cow can't give you any additional horticultural advice. Please go to www.gardenorganic.org.uk for more information.

Remember! Get your entries in by July 9th 2008 (Gardens) and Sept 19th 2008 (Sunflowers & Tip-Taps). Winners will be contacted within ten days of these dates.

Rules

The competition is open to anyone aged 14 or under. You can be an individual, family, club, class, or school. Entrants must use organic pesticides or fertilisers. Using peat is not allowed. Each Bag Garden and Mini-Bag entry needs to be accompanied by a separate entry form. No employee of Send a Cow, or relative of a Send a Cow employee may enter.
